

# FLYING OF FLAGS POLICY

### A. Purpose

To specify the flags to be flown by the District Council of Loxton Waikerie. This policy applies to the District Council of Loxton and Waikerie offices' flag poles.

### B. Policy

### 1. Flying of Flags at Council

The Council flag poles are located at the following locations:

- East Terrace, Loxton and
- Strangman Road, Waikerie

The Loxton location has two flag poles and will fly the Australian flag on a daily basis. The second flag pole is able to fly the Australian, South Australian, Australian Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island flags – with the latter two as part of recognition arrangements from the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet.

The Waikerie location has one flag pole and flies the Australian flag only.

### 2. Flag Flying Guidelines

- 1. The Australian flag is treated with the respect and dignity it deserves.
- 2. Raised no earlier than first light and lowered no later than dusk.
- 3. Raised briskly and lowered with dignity
- 4. Flown aloft and free, as close to the top of the flag mast as possible and with the rope tightly secured and;
- 5. Illuminated if flown at night

### 3. Flying the Australian Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Flag

If there is only one flagpole available, the Australian Aboriginal Flag and the Torres Strait Islander Flag should not replace the Australian National Flag.

If there are two flagpoles available, it is at the discretion of the authority concerned to determine which flag should be flown with the Australian National Flag.

The Australian Aboriginal Flag and the Torres Strait Islander Flag should be flown on additional flagpoles, where available, next to or near the Australian National Flag

Days of commemoration on which the flying of the Australian National Flag and where appropriate, other flags, particularly encouraged by the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet unless known otherwise, these days are celebrated nationally.

- 26 January Australia Day
- 13 February Anniversary of the Apology to Members of the Stolen Generation
- 21 March Harmony Day celebrating Australia's success as a diverse society united as one family by a common set of values
- 27 May to 3 June National Reconciliation Week 27 May as the anniversary of the 1967 Referendum which successfully removed from the Constitution clauses that discriminated against Indigenous Australians and 3 June as the anniversary of the High Court decision in the Eddie Mabo land rights case of 1992.
- 24 October United Nations Day
